Fund currently stands at £54,304.70.

The Village Voices had been a successful event and raised approximately £300. The scarecrow festival is to take place on 10^{th} September with the addition of stalls this year in the hall.

(2581) Dyke near Village Hall

Cllr Greenbank had done some investigating and he believes that the dyke does not need clearing he suggested putting some dye in when there has been heavy rainfall to ascertain if there is a blockage, he thinks this could be on the school playground.

Once this has been done findings can be passed to ERYC for them to investigate further.

The speed surveys had been received and the findings showed the average speed for the northbound was 30.6mph and southbound was 34.7mph. Clerk had contacted PCSO Darren Bainton asking if any speed checks could be carried out in the village, he advised that they had recently obtained and purchased two batteries for the handheld speed devices so he would put Sproatley on the list.
