## (2542) St Swithins Church

Cllr Cockbill advised that the total raised so far is approximately £19,500. The committee had a meeting with an architect in York regarding advice on the porch which is not moving at the moment but has since the stitching previously done.

There are 3 options - further stitching, propping up the porch or demolition all together and storing the bricks for when it is rebuilt.

The committee are looking into separate funding for the porch as it needs doing fairly quickly and could be quite costly for a new porch. All the options are to be discussed at the next PCC meeting. Another public meeting is to be held on 26<sup>th</sup> March.

# (2557) Highways & Parking
